ANNUAL FEES

Tuition fees include subject fees, resource/technology fees, and general excursions. Camps and retreats are compulsory and incur an additional charge. Textbooks, laptops, and uniforms are not included.

Our Boarding School accommodates secondary students from Years 7 to 12. Boarding fees are additional to tuition fees and cover meals and accommodation. Activity fees cover recreational facilities and activities. Food and activity components include GST.

ADDITIONAL CHARGES:

In addition to tuition and Boarding fees, optional programs and activities may incur additional costs. These fees will be billed separately and payable upfront, at the time of registration/enrolment:

- Extra-Curricular activities, events and tours (e.g. optional Sport, Music, the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award).
- Courses offered by external providers (e.g. TAFE, NSW School of Languages, Sydney Distance Education High School or Southern Cross College).

SIBLING DISCOUNT

A 10% sibling discount applies to tuition fees for the first and subsequent siblings enrolled concurrently at the College.

HOW FEES ARE BILLED

Families receive an annual invoice at the start of the year detailing fees and charges:

- Annual tuition fees and charges are invoiced in full at the start of 2026.
- Camps and retreats are compulsory and non-refundable. The cost is in addition to the tuition fees and will be invoiced at the start of 2026.
- Fee statements will be emailed in January 2026 from fees@scholastica.nsw.edu.au.
- The College does not issue split bills. Enrolling parents/guardians are responsible, jointly and severally, for the payment of all College tuition fees and other charges.

FEE PAYMENT OPTIONS

The College offers the following payment options to assist families in managing fees:

1. Upfront Payment in Full:

One payment of total fees is payable in February 2026. Payments can be made via BPAY or Credit Card/Debit Card.

2. Instalment Plan:

Families who choose to pay fees by instalments, must be registered with School EasyPay at the start of the year. For assistance, please contact the Business Office at:

School EasyPay instalments are processed via a direct debit from your nominated bank account or credit/debit card. Available options:

- 16 fortnightly instalments (March to October)
- 8 monthly instalments (March to October)
- 2 semester instalments (March and July)

Instalment plans are only available through School EasyPay. If instalments are missed, the full remaining balance of annual fees becomes immediately payable.

ADVANCE PAYMENT OF FEES BEYOND 2026

If parents/guardians wish to pay tuition and or Boarding fees for a period greater than one year, please contact the Director of Business & Finance for a specific quote.

PAYMENT OF FEES

All fees for 2026 must be paid in full by the end of November 2026. If payment difficulties arise, please contact the Business Office early to arrange a suitable solution.

Where payment terms are not met and no approved formal arrangement exists, the full balance becomes immediately due.

The Principal may request a meeting and, if necessary, initiate external debt recovery.

NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL

To avoid unnecessary charges, where a student withdraws from the College or Boarding, one full term's notice in writing must be provided .

If notice is not given, one term's fees (10-weeks) will be payable in lieu of notice.

TAX-DEDUCTIBLE DONATIONS

We encourage all families to support the ongoing development of the College by contributing to the Building Fund. These contributions are greatly appreciated and play an essential role in securing the future of the College. The College requests an annual donation of \$400. All donations of \$2 or more are tax-deductible and can be included as part of your instalment plan.

Terms & Condition Notice

DOMESTIC STUDENTS

The College acknowledges the commitment of parents who choose St Scholastica's College Glebe, a school of Good Samaritan Education, for their daughter's education. Each year the College Board reviews and sets the fees at a level that supports excellence in teaching and learning and ensures the effective operation of the College. A significant portion of the annual budget is allocated to staff salaries, with additional provisions for teaching and learning resources, maintenance, capital loan repayments, refurbishment and building projects.

As a not-for-profit entity, the College relies primarily on fee income for its ongoing operations. Timely payment of fees is therefore essential to maintain efficient operations and sound financial management.

Please note: Tuition fees do not include costs for courses offered by external institutions (e.g., TAFE, Distance Education, NSW School of Languages), textbooks, laptops, uniforms, overnight camps, overnight retreats, or optional extra-curricular activities such as sport and music.

Fees are subject to change.

1. Fees

Parents/guardians who signed the enrolment form (whether living together or formally separated) are jointly and severally responsible for payment of all fees (tuition/boarding and other charges). The College does not issue split bills to parents/guardians.

1.1 Fee Statements

Annual tuition fees and charges are invoiced in full at the start of the year. Fee statements will be emailed in January 2026 from fees@scholastica.nsw.edu.au. Please note you cannot access fee statements or pay tuition fees via Compass.

1.2 Fee Payments - School EasyPay

Parents/guardians who choose to pay by instalments must be registered with School EasyPay at the start of the year. Payment plans are only available through EasyPay - no other method is accepted. To register, use the EasyPay link provided on the fee statement and nominate a bank account (fee free), credit card (incurs a 1.85% fee) or debit card (incurs 1.32% fee). Instalments are direct debited as per the nominated frequency options below:

Fortnightly:

16 equal fortnightly instalments from 12 March 2026 to 8 October 2026 with each payment being one-sixteenth of total annual fees and charges.

Monthly:

Eight equal fortnightly instalments processed on the 20th of each month from 20 March 2026 to 20 October 2026 with each payment being one-eighth of the total annual fees and charges.

Semesterly:

Two equal semesterly instalments processed on 24 March 2026 and 24 July 2026 each of which is half of the annual total fees and charges.

Once registered, the direct debit arrangement will be operational for the duration of your child's attendance at St Scholastica's College.

Any changes must be made in writing to the Business Office (fees@scholastica.nsw.edu.au).

For parents/guardians already registered with School EasyPay and paying via School EasyPay instalments in 2025, there is NO ACTION required. Your instalments will continue as per your previously nominated frequency commencing March 2026.

If instalment payments are missed, the full balance of annual fees outstanding becomes immediately due.

1.3 Upfront Payment in Full

Upfront payment of annual tuition fees and charges in full, is due by 28 February 2026. Payment can be made via BPay (fee free) or by debit card (fee free) or credit card (fees apply) via BPOINT. Payment instructions and links are provided on the fee statement.

1.4 Advance Payment of Fees Beyond 2026

To pay fees more than a year in advance, please contact the Director of Business & Finance for a quote.

1.5 Late Payment of School Fees

All fees must be paid in full by 30 November 2026.

It is a condition of acceptance and admission of each child into the College that parents/guardians meet their obligation to pay school fees when due.

Where payment terms are not met and no formal agreement exists, the full balance becomes immediately due. The Principal may request a meeting and if necessary initiate external debt recovery.

If fees remain outstanding after the due date, the College reserves the right to:

- deny the return of a student;
- deny the enrolment of a sibling;
- exclude the student from some extra-curricular activities including (but not limited to) trips and overseas exchanges;
- deny enrolment in courses offered with external providers, including but not limited to, TAFE, Southern Cross College, Sydney Distance Education High School, NSW School of Languages;
- withdraw the student from the College.

1.6 Debt Collection

Where parents/guardians fail to pay by the due date, do not respond to reminder notices and do not contact the College to make alternative arrangements, the College may engage the services of a professional debt collection agency or solicitor. Thereafter, all payment negotiations must be conducted directly with the debt collection agency.

By signing the enrolment application, parents/guardians agree to indemnify the College for any legal, mercantile agent or collection costs incurred in recovering outstanding fees.

2. Sibling Discount

A sibling discount applies where families have more than one student concurrently enrolled at the College. A 10% discount applies to the tuition fees of the first and subsequent siblings. For the purpose of these concessions, 'sibling' means a sister of a current student having either one or both parents in common (including by way of adoption recognised at law), or as otherwise agreed by the College in its discretion. Stepsiblings are not eligible for the discount.

3. Camps and Year 11 Retreat

Year 7 camp, Year 10 camp and Year 11 retreat are compulsory and non-refundable. The cost is in addition to the tuition fees and will be invoiced at the start of the year and included on your fee statement.

4. Non-Refundable Application Fee and Acceptance Fee

- A non-refundable application fee of \$330 (including GST) is payable when an enrolment application form is lodged.
- A non-refundable fee of \$2,500 for each student is payable on acceptance of an offer.

5. Withdrawal

Where a student withdraws from the College, one full term's notice in writing must be provided to the College Principal and Enrolments Office:

This notice must be signed by the parents/guardians and received before the last school day of the term prior to the term of exit. Where a student is leaving at the end of the school year, notice must be provided by the last day of Term 3.

Any outstanding fees or charges must be finalised by the student's last day at the College. Any textbooks, library books or IT equipment on loan to the student by the College must be returned by the student's last day. Parents/guardians will be responsible for the replacement cost of any items not returned.

Where a student is withdrawn from the College without a full term's notice; a late withdrawal notification fee of one full term's tuition fees (plus GST), excluding any sibling discount, is applicable.

If a student is withdrawn from the College and wishes to return at a future date, the non-refundable acceptance fee previously paid will not be retained to hold a place. A new application must be made.

6. Contact Details of Parents and Guardians

It is the responsibility of parents/guardians to ensure that their contact details are kept up-to-date in Compass. For change of address please send an email to the Office: office@scholastica.nsw.edu.au.

7. Voluntary Contributions - Building Fund

To support ongoing campus maintenance and development, each family is invited to make a voluntary, tax-deductible contribution of \$400 to the College Building Fund. These funds help reduce borrowings for major capital works.

8. Scholarship and Bursary Fund and First Nations Fund

Families are encouraged to contribute to the Scholarship and Bursary Fund and/or the First Nations Fund. These funds assist students in financial need and support the College's commitment to First Nations education.

9. Tax Deductibility

The College Building Fund and the Scholarship and Bursary Fund are endorsed as deductible gift recipients (DGR) under Subdivision 30-BA of the Income Tax Assessment Act (ITAA) 1997. Contributions of \$2 or above to one or both funds are fully tax deductible.

Donations to the First Nations Fund (which supports the longstanding tradition of First Nations' education and the 'closing the gap' initiative), are not tax deductible.
